Chartwells expanded their packed lunch meal option and as a result many children enjoyed a healthy packed lunch outside (when the weather was kind) with their friends.






This week we began our Science topic all about electricity. We learnt about different types of components in an electric circuit and experimented with our own circuits to see if we could make the components work!








Class 3 Star of the Week: Bailey Class 4 Star of the Week:

As more of us are beginning to make journeys on our own or with friends, we took part in a live online lesson with Julia from Hampshire Road Safety Team. We participated in polls where we had to make choices about when we are most at risk on the roads. We re-capped the Green Cross Code and talked about giving the road our full attention and discussed bike and helmet safety.





What an exciting day we had when our Viking friend came to visit and teach us more about the era of Viking and Anglo-Saxon rule. The hall became a battle field where we re-enacted the Battle of Stamford Bridge with shields, swords and helmets. We were able to explore replica artefacts, take part in a quiz and participate in a Viking burial.





We embarked on the Science part of our topic, looking at water resistance, streamlining and upthrust. This was linked to the Viking's need for having boats that moved swiftly through the water. We made our own boats from plasticine to test the different shapes and designs.





As a Federation, we celebrated Sunshine Day. After a fantastic morning taking part in a variety of physical and mindful activities, we spent the afternoon focusing on friendship and how to respectfully make connections with our peers. We played an emotions game, which helped us to discuss how we feel at different times. We had an extended playtime to try out some games.





This week we focused on completing our sewing art project where we were combining and layering materials and adding detail through a variety of stitches. Our designs were based on Viking or Anglo-Saxon ideas. The results looked fantastic displayed in the corridor!





This week, during our topic sessions, we discussed puberty and the changes that take place as we grow. On Friday, Class 5 finished their last swimming session of the year. In English we explored a form of poetry known as Kennings and created our own with a theme of Vikings. These were then typed into our PowerPoint presentations and shared with our peers.





In the last week of term, we investigated pulleys and gears, using a range of equipment. In our groups we had to use our resilience as it was a fiddly job! Our English learning journey was focusing on mini sagas where we created a monster to fight Beowulf.
