

Pre-School



The Pre-School children have settled in well and they have been busy exploring resources and building relationships with each other. Our Topic was *Rhymes* and we have focussed on a different Nursery Rhyme each week. The children have enjoyed building walls for Humpty Dumpty, using pipettes to change Baa Baa from white to black and rescuing Incy Wincy from a sticky web. They have also explored different

sized boats and guttering for Row Row Row Your Boat.

Our Focus Book was *Walking Through the Jungle* by Julie Lacome. The children have enjoyed recalling parts of the story and moving around in different ways. They have been looking at different jungle animals and making sounds to represent them such as "ssssssssss" for the snake and "Roaaaar" for the lion.

We finished the term with a Nursery Rhyme themed Stay & Play where parents came to join in their children taking part in themed activities. All the children have received a book to take home and share with their family.




Next half term Year 1 will be starting their new topic which is all about toys.

We started back to school with our Art Week. Our inspiration was Picasso and we produced artwork using colours and patterns to show how we were feeling about starting Year 6. We also voted for house captains and vice house captains. Congratulations to the winners:

As part of our washed away topic, we have been learning about rivers. The children were able to work in groups and build their own river so they could get a real understanding of the different parts of a river and how they are formed (source, waterfall, meander, main channel, tributary, delta and mouth).



In Science, Year 6 have been investigating micro-organisms and how they develop, specifically mould. The children worked in groups and selected an area around the school to rub bread on, which was then put into clear bags to observe the mould growth over a two week period.

In English, the children have been writing their own twisted fairy tale based on Little Red Riding Hood. In their stories they needed to make sure that the poor wolf was shown as the innocent one. This piece of writing focused on speech, punctuation and expanding their vocabulary when describing characters.



This week the children were able to have a taster session in fencing. They learned what safety equipment was needed to do fencing, how to move their bodies correctly, how to battle their opponent and the different language used when challenging an opponent.

This year we gave the children the opportunity to decide how the our school Harvest assembly was going to run. Year 6 opened the assembly by informing the rest of the school about why we celebrate Harvest and how is it celebrated around the world.
