
Averds

Number Day was a great success with many children taking part in 'dress up for digits'. The Junior School children really enjoyed the NSPCC Rocks challenge which required children to correctly answer as many multiplication and division questions as possible.

Across the country, 85,853,488 questions were answered collectively by 277,437 pupils from more than 3,870 schools and 22,268 classes around the country! Overall, Wallisdean Junior School came 572nd.

Online Safe

In Wallisdean Infant School we have been reading more Digiduck stories in our E-Safety Assemblies this half term. We read the story 'Digiduck's Famous Friend' and learnt that:

- We should keep our personal details private and not share our full names, address and where we go to school.

- Sometimes people might ask you to do something you are unsure about, like add them as a friend or send a photo of yourself. If this happens or anything makes you feel worried or upset tell a grown up you trust straight away.


School we played games which lead to discussion about how technology's design can influence people's choices and how we can manage that

As a federation, we strive to make sure there is space for conversation about feeling around life online and acknowledge that influence and persuasion can be managed.





In the Infant School we have had half termly whole school assemblies based on mental health and well-being. During Children's Mental Health Week (5th-9th February), we held a whole school assembly about 'What makes you happy?' The children were encourage to think about and discuss what makes them happy. In PSHE, the children thought about 'What makes you and your friends special?'. Stormbreaks have continued to be trialed across some classes and will soon be implemented into all timetables.



Once a week, whole school assemblies have continued at the Junior School with a focus on mental health and well-being. These assemblies focus on the five ways to well-being (to connect, be active, take notice, to give, to learn new things).

During Children's Mental Health week, there was an assembly and the children completed an activity in PSHE linked to the theme 'What makes you and your friends special?'.

Key information from the Senior Mental Health Lead training has been shared with staff and Governors to continue to develop a whole school approach to mental health.

Helpful T I P S

It would be really helpful if your child could continue to practise counting in their 2s,5s and 10s over the half term. In our maths lessons, we have noticed lots of children are confident with counting in 2s but less confident in 5s and 10s. We have also been learning about multiplication and division, so any practise at home would really help your child in school!

Next half term, our new topic is all about the Navy. If you have any naval connections in your family we would love for you to share this with your child and send anything you have that they may like to share on our homework email. We hope you have a lovely half term!

He's has remained patient when helping others as well as giving them words of encouragement and tips to improve. Tiger Class— Music Maestro Danny for confidently answering questions and sharing his thoughts and opinions about two pieces of dragon music - keep it up Danny! and PE Perfector Annabelle for her listening and engagement as she has managed to stay focused on improving her skills and avoiding the distraction of others. This week we have been finishing lots of our learning such as performing our final dance routines in PE as well as finishing our second English journey. We have also been working hard in Maths, recalling our knowledge of money and learning how to make different amounts. We had to be resilient as some of us found this tricky!





Year 2 have been working really hard on correctly forming and beginning to join their letters. In Maths the children have also been working on knowing their 10's, 5's and 2's times tables. It would be really helpful if the children could continue this practise during the half term break to support their writing ready for their new English journey when they come back and further their maths knowledge of number.

After half term, we will be continuing learning about Titchfield, Fareham and Portsmouth. We will be learning about Charles Dickens in History. As a challenge, we would like Year 2 to do some research and come back with three

This week, Year 3 started their new topic 'Extreme Earth'. Our hook into the topic was to make dessert pot layers of the earth. This involved using custard, chocolate mousse, crushed up biscuits and bread crumbs to identify the different layers of our Earth. We then placed a Jelly Baby on top to represent ourselves.

This week, we have finished reading the Usborne Early Readers version of Pompeii. We have thoroughly enjoyed reading this story and have so many questions to ask. We spent some time in English playing a 'Think and Link' game where we had to link characters, objects, events and places together to develop our comprehension.

This week, we used maps, atlases, globes and digital maps to locate countries which have earthquakes and/or volcanoes. We found out all about the Pacific Ocean Ring of Fire where most of the worlds' volcanoes and earthquakes are located. As well as this, we watched clips of the volcanic eruption in Iceland.

This week, Year 3 were rock detectives in Science and started to look at 6 different types of rocks. We carried out 3 different experiments where we tested to see if the rocks reacted with acid, whether they were permeable and how hard the rocks were.

This week, we explored the Rock Cycle through a practical activity. First, we chopped sweets up to represent sediment. We then squeezed them to represent sedimentary rock. After this, we added pressure and heat to form metamorphic rock. Finally, we applied more heat to form molten rock which hardened to form igneous rock.

This week, we have ended our topic, Extreme Earth, by erupting some of our volcanoes that we made for homework. We have loved this topic and found this a very exciting way to end.





This half term, we have been working hard on telling the time to five-minute intervals on analogue and 12-hour digital clocks. Please continue to encourage your child to tell the time.

Alongside your half termly homework, please continue to encourage your child to practise times tables; this can be on TT Rockstars or in homework books.

Our next topic is The Ancient Egyptians. Please look out for the half termly homework sheet. The standard of homework has been very high this year so we look forward to seeing what Year 3 produce next half term!

Year 4 returned to school after the Christmas break ready to embark on their new topic of the Mary Rose. We have investigated how warships have changed over time and thought about the reasons for this. In RE we explored different ideas about God, what he might look like and why Christians believe in him. We prepared questions which Miss Gedge answered for us.

This week we have continued to learn about the Mary Rose and are preparing to write a survivor's recount from its sinking. The children prepared freeze frames to show possible events from the sinking, which they thoroughly enjoyed. In PE Year 4 are choreographing a sea shanty, which they will perform to each other.

In PHSE we learned about the importance of rail safety. As we have train lines close to school, this was crucial for the children's safety.
